- Article 1 The National Taiwan Normal University (hereinafter referred to as NTNU or “the University”) Graduate Institute of International Human Resource Development’s (hereinafter referred to as “the Graduate Institute”) *Director Election Regulations* (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”) were established in accordance with Article 13 of the *University Act* and Article 35 of NTNU’s *Organizational Charter*.
- Article 2 The director of the Graduate Institute shall be elected by the full-time and jointly appointed faculty members (professors, associate professors, and assistant professors) of the Graduate Institute.
- Article 3 All full-time and jointly appointed faculty members (professors, associate professors, and assistant professors) of the Graduate Institute are eligible for candidacy as director. However, if the eligible persons are unwilling or unable to concurrently serve, then full-time NTNU instructors in related departments or graduate institutes who have been issued an Academic Teaching Rank Accreditation Certificate (Associate Professor/Professor) by the Ministry of Education may be recommended to the Institute General Meeting for director candidacy.
- Article 4 Director elections shall only be considered effective if two-thirds of the members as stipulated in Article 2 are in attendance to vote in the election. The election shall be held two months before the end of the term of the exiting director.
- Article 5 Director elections shall be held in the form of a first-past-the-post secret ballot. The candidate with the highest number of votes and a majority of the votes from those in attendance shall be elected. If no election result is reached under these rules, a re-election shall be held according to the above procedures.
- Article 6 Election results shall be submitted by the current director or interim director to the dean in accordance with the stipulated administrative procedures; the dean will then submit the results to the president for approval of the concurrent appointment.
- Article 7 The director of the Graduate Institute shall be appointed to a two-year term and may be reelected once.
- Article 8 If, due to a major incident, over half of the Graduate Institute’s full-time and jointly employed teachers petition for the dismissal of the director, the dean shall convene the Institute General Meeting; affirmative votes from at least two-thirds of the Graduate Institute’s full-time and jointly employed teachers are required for the motion to pass and be submitted to the president for approval and removal of the director from office.
- Article 9 If the director position becomes vacant before the end of the term of office, the dean shall convene the Institute General Meeting to accept nominations and select an interim director from among the nominated candidates. The interim director shall hold a director re-election in accordance with the Regulations.

Article 10 Matters not addressed herein shall be subject to the applicable NTNU regulations.

Article 11 These Guidelines shall be promulgated and take effect after being passed at the Institute General Meeting and approved by the president. The same applies to all subsequent amendments
