- 1. These Guidelines are promulgated to encourage outstanding postgraduate students in doctoral, master's, continuing education master's and in-service master's programs to further their studies.
- 2. This scholarship is funded by the University's annual budget.
- 3. Each department or graduate institute shall nominate students according to the allocated quota. The quota allocation is as follows:
 - (1) Each department or graduate institute shall nominate one student in each class of doctoral, master's, continuing education master's or in-service master's program. The number of recipients must be nominated according to the allocated quota and cannot be increased even if the total amount of scholarship remains unchanged.
 - (2) One additional nominee may be added to each academic system for every additional 50 students in each academic system.
- 4. This scholarship shall be awarded once per semester. First-year students are not eligible in their first semester of school. Each recipient in doctoral programs will receive NT\$20,000 per semester, and each recipient in master's degree (including continuing education and in-service) programs will receive NT\$15,000 per semester. Each recipient of the scholarship will be awarded a certificate of excellence as a token of encouragement.
- 5. The eligibility for this scholarship is as follows:
 - (1) The student must be enrolled in the current (summer) semester, taken at least two subjects with at least four credits (excluding dissertation credit) in the previous semester or current summer semester, and has not failed any subject.
 - (2) The student must exhibit potential to engage in academic research or demonstrate outstanding performance as a role model for their peers. For example, they have participated in research projects, presented papers in

academic seminars, published papers in peer-reviewed journals or participated in art exhibitions.

- 6. Recipients of this scholarship may not concurrently receive other scholarships offered by the University or the government during the current semester (summer), except for the Special Attribute Grant in Departments or Graduate Institutes.
- 7. The recipients of this scholarship shall be nominated by each department or graduate institute, and the certificate of excellence and scholarship funds are disbursed by the Office of Student Affairs.
- 8. These Guidelines and any amendments thereto become effective after approval by the Student Affairs Committee and ratification by the University President.
